## **Essential Knowledge**

By the end of this unit children will...

- Know about the set up and roles in an airport.
- Use atlases and maps to locate countries around the world.
- Understand the term migration.
- Compose music related to flight using a range of instruments.

History and Geography	English		
<ul> <li>History</li> <li>Children to be able to recall information about the first ever flight and the jet era. <ul> <li>Events beyond living memory that are significant nationally or globally.</li> <li>The lives of significant individuals in the past who have contributed to National and International achievements.</li> <li>Begin to ask historical questions.</li> <li>Use artefacts, pictures, stories and online sources to find out about the past.</li> <li>Begin to describe historical events.</li> <li>Name significant people from the past.</li> <li>Begin to recognise that there are reasons why people in the past acted as they did.</li> <li>With support, place events in order on a timeline.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Geography</li> <li>Children to learn about the migration of birds and map out migration patterns.</li> <li>Use compass directions (NSEW) and locational language E.g. Near and far to describe the location of features and routes on map.</li> <li>Use a simple map and basic symbols in a key</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>*Write messages about themselves to attach to a balloon.</li> <li>*Create Diary Entry Blogs about their Hot Air Balloon Ride.</li> <li>*Create fact files about topical figures.</li> <li>*Write a postcard from their holiday destination.</li> <li>saying out loud what they are going to write about;</li> <li>composing a sentence orally before writing it;</li> <li>*Discuss what they have written with the teacher or other pupils.</li> <li>*Reread their writing to check it makes sense</li> <li>spell words containing each of the 40+ phonemes already taught;</li> <li>Joining words and joining clauses using and</li> <li>Separation of words with spaces; Spell many Year 1 common exception words correctly</li> <li>Introduction to capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks to demarcate sentences.</li> <li>Capital letters for names and for the personal pronoun 'I.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li><u>Art</u> Recreate impressionist art to create a painting of a hot air balloon. <ul> <li>Using thick and thin brushes. Use digital media to create texture, line, colour, and shape (see sketchbook app) </li> <li><u>Design Technology</u> Use papier-mâché techniques to create and decorate their own hot air balloons. <ul> <li>Use papier as a material; Use techniques such as cutting &amp; moulding.</li> </ul> Design and make own paper aeroplanes <ul> <li>Explore objects and designs to identify likes and dislikes of the designs.</li> <li>Design products that have a clear purpose and an intended user.</li> <li>Make products</li> </ul></li></ul></li></ul>
